This week in Reception, our little learners have had an absolute blast exploring the world of *Oliver's Vegetables*! This delightful story not only sparked their imaginations but also introduced them to the wonderful variety of fruits and vegetables. Throughout the week we have tried: beetroot, spinach, cabbage and radishes. Spinach was a particular success. On Wednesday we had a great time creating fruit kebabs where the children chopped and tasted a variety of fruits. Many were very brave to try fruits they had never tasted before. Ask your child what their favourite fruit or vegetable was and encourage them to try even more new ones!



Next week our story of the week will be *The Three Little Pigs*. Some of the learning will include:

- Learning the phonemes ck, e, r, u
- Learning to retell the story aloud by following a story map
- Acting out the story of the week
- Creating a pig collage by scrunching paper
- Learning to retell the story aloud by following a story map
- Counting objects carefully to learn about cardinality (the last number indicates how many in a set)

Water bottles

The children have been given a challenge to finish their water bottle every day. They earn a house point each time they finish their water bottle. Remind them to ask for it to be filled up though. Please remember only water in the bottles.

Reading books

Keep focusing on oral blending when reading the lilac books. e.g. point to the b-o-a-t or find me something beginning with t t t t. Next week we will send home a little set of letters that we have learned so far. Practise making small words out of them and reading them.
